We invite the submission of theory, empirical, and policy- oriented papers on topics related to the economics of two-sided markets. Particular emphasis will be given to **payment systems**, but we are also interested in other industries like **telecommunications**, **Internet**, **software**, **media**, **intermediaries**, The primary focus is on academic research, but we intend to organize one or two panel sessions to confront the views of industry experts and regulators, for instance on antitrust issues.

Among the topics to be addressed during the conference are:

- **General properties of two-sided markets:** definition, classification, determinants of price structure,
- Pricing strategies of platforms: theory and practice,
- Institutional arrangements and governance issues: private platforms Vs cooperatives,
- Regulation and antitrust issues: tie-ins, interchange fees, exclusivity clauses.
