"BEHAVIOURAL ENVIRONMENTAL ECONOMICS"

The purpose of the workshop is to bring together researchers in behavioural economics, environmental economics and psychology to present and discuss their on going research on issues at the interface between economics, environment, psychology and public policy.

Possible topics include:

- Consumers' attitude and behaviour toward green products
- Citizens' perception of environmental risks
- Climate change understanding and reaction
- Moral feelings (guilt, shame, pride, etc.) regarding environmental issues
- Counter-consumerism movements
- Environmental norms and values
- Individual and corporate social responsibility
- Green nudges
- The psychology of environmental tax / quantity regulation

Organization: About 15 papers will be selected for presentation. Conference organizers will provide three-day accommodation, food and reimburse economy travel costs for invited presenters. A special session for PhD students may be organised.
